

Surgical Wrap Masks

Hello! We are a group of seamstresses making masks from surgical wraps, and we welcome anyone who would like to join our group. The wraps are being collected from the St. Cloud Hospital and have not been exposed to patients.

If interested, you will be supplied with a kit that contains all of the supplies needed to make 25 or 50 masks, along with instructions and a completed mask (for reference). The sewing is not difficult but the masks are rather “putsy” to make, taking about 15 minutes each. Your willingness to sew is very much appreciated & we would encourage you to keep some of the masks, if you would like. Once returned, the masks are being distributed to local community groups & individuals.



The masks are NOT disposable and can be disinfected/sanitized in the following ways:

- Using a bottle or cpap mask sterilizer
- Baked in a 200-225 oven for 10-15 mins
- Sprayed with disinfectant & allowed to dry
- Used in a 3-day rotation to decrease the contamination level

This mask consists of two layers of Halyard H600 medical fabric. The blue side is the right side and will face out.

The mask has passed the Respirator Fit Test.

NOTE: The masks will be sterilized after they are returned to the hospital.
