

## **Now Hiring! 2019 GREAT Summer Theatre Camp Instructor**

**Qualities:** Mature, responsible, friendly, caring and creative individual who is capable of leading, directing and encouraging youth of all ages, abilities and cultures ages 4-18.

GREAT's Child Safety Policy requires that each camp be taught by two adults of legal age (18 and above). We encourage students grades 8th-12th to apply for our Summer Internship Program.

**Job Description:** Camp instructors are responsible for creating a fun and nurturing learning environment that truly engages campers! Instructors should be self starters who are full of initiative, positive, and have critical thinking skills. Must be comfortable interacting with children and parents and pass background check.

**Musical In A Week Instructor** (1 position): Work in partnership with another camp instructor to create a full musical performance for ages 8-18 from auditions (everyone gets a role!) as you build acting, singing and dancing skills of students. Experience with teaching, directing, and choreography a plus, musical direction and/or piano is preferred. (1 Full-time - 8:30-4:30 M-F starting June 10, stipend \$500/week)

**Imagination Playtime Instructors** (2-3 positions): Work in partnership with another camp instructor to explore creative drama activities based on a weekly theme through movement, song and games for ages 4 -7. In a classroom setting this class includes an introduction to theater skills, script reading and a special final sharing time on the last day with their family. Experience with teaching, directing, or acting a plus. (2 Part-time - 8:30-12 M-F starting June 10, stipend \$230/week; 1 Full-time 8:30-4:30 M-F starting June 3, stipend \$500/week)

**Playwriting Instructor** (1 position): Work in partnership with another camp instructor to explore and develop playwriting skills centered around a theme with 5th-9th grade students. This week-long class includes utilizing a variety of active writing strategies, games, and activities to develop creative script writing and will culminate with an informal staged reading of student

works. Experience with teaching, playwriting, acting, directing, or technical theater a plus. (1  
Part-time - 12-4:30 M-F, June 10-14, June 17-21, July 15-19, Stipend/\$300 week )
